The five were locked up Brooklyn. at the Gates Avenue police station. Brooklyn, and will be arraigned in Brooklyn Felony Court today.

The raiders reported that they found the five men scated around a table bearing 35,000 policy slips, which, they said, represented a daily

take of \$1,000. However, there was no cash in the place. According to Edward A. Heffernan, Assistant District Attorney of Kings County, the numbers game for which the 287

Hancock Street basement was the bank, with Balzak supposedly the chief banker, used to be served by twenty-six drop stations where slips were deposited, but after Babchick's
