Heinrich, Dec. 29 (AP)—Finnish troops from the crack Moscow garrison were thrown against the Finnish Mannerheim line today in a new attack.

Earlier, a Copenhagen dispatch said Russia was massing 150,000 crack troops from Siberia and the Caucasus on the Karelian isthmus for a decisive attack, according to Scandinavian press reports.

Today marked the end of the first month of the Russo-Finnish war, a war which the world expects to last about a week in all.

For his chief assistant he went into the ranks of the city's top practicing attorneys and appointed Joseph F. Hanley of Flatbush, a six-foot, World War Army captain, whose selection turned out to be a stunning surprise to the political rank and file.

For the chief clerkship of his office Judge O'Dwyer chose another husky, six-foot individual, James Moran, who had been his aide in the County Court.

He modified only slightly his original edict but two of retiring District Attorney Geoghan's assistants would be allowed to join his administration, and looked on as a few members of the old staff were sworn in by Acting County Clerk James A. Kelly.

As Judge O'Dwyer was announcing his appointments, a tense situation prevailed in political ranks, and Democratic politicians, unable previously to learn the identity of his slate of appointees, burned up the telephone wires to obtain their first knowledge of his choices.
